

The weeks seem to be flying by in school, with our children and staff working hard in all areas of their learning. Currently, we are especially considering two important themes: Road Safety Week and Children in Need.

Throughout this week, we have been thinking about road safety and the ways in which we can all be a hero by sharing responsibility for making our roads safe. This includes ensuring our children **respect** other users by walking calmly along our roads or, for example, by not using their mobile phones when walking near or crossing roads. They can also take the **opportunity** to travel by cycling or scooting, ensuring they wear a helmet so that they are safe. ### **UNIFORM PRICING**

School Trends, who supply our uniform, are, like many businesses, subject to the current volatility in global manufacturing, transport and currency exchange, largely caused by the global pandemic. Whilst over the last year they have absorbed a number of price increases from suppliers, they now have to once again spread some of these increasing costs across their product range. This means that their range of products will see a slight increase (average 5%) in price from Monday 22nd November 2021.



On Wednesday 15th December, the catering team will be providing a festive menu meal option. Please inform the school office if your child usually has a packed lunch and would like a school dinner on this day (at the usual meal price of £2.75). # FEEDBACK FROM VIRTUAL MEETING WITH THE CATERING CONTRACT MANAGER AND EXECUTIVE CHEF FROM CHARTWELLS -- OUR NEW CATERING CONTRACTOR

As previously notified, the virtual meeting with Chartwells regarding school meals was held on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> November. It was attended by David Westerby (Headteacher), Gill Sax (School Business Leader), Lyn Randall (Social Emotional Mental Health Lead), Yordan Yordanov (Chartwells Contract Manager for Greenwich Schools), Dominic Honeysett (Chartwells Executive Chef for Greenwich Schools).

Six parents also attended the meeting.

Two questions were received in advance of the meeting. These are below, with responses from Chartwells:

Question: Their menu looks good, but unfortunately my child says that the food actually doesn't taste very good. I promise, my child is not a fussy eater.

Is there any way to improve the food to make it appetising? Healthy and nutritious food can be tasty too. I know this is only a school meal, and Chartwells is not some fancy restaurant, but it will be good to improve the taste of the food so that the children can be encouraged to finish their whole plate of food (to avoid wastage).

Answer: We absolutely agree. Healthy and nutritious food is TASTY and we meticulously refine our recipes to be as delicious as they can be. We would very much appreciate feedback of any meal item a child is not happy with. Our recipes closely follow School Food Standards. We do not include any added salt, but use different cooking techniques to bring out the natural flavour in produce. It maybe the unit chef requires some training in cooking techniques to ensure the dish is served at its best.

Question: Unhealthy food, such as Southern Fried Chicken, still appears on the menu. Why?

Answer: The Southern Fried Chicken Goujons are actually a breadcrumbed product which we cook through the oven. We do not fry any of our food items on the menu. The chicken is made from whole pieces of chicken fillet. Thanks to the feedback we have received from Greenwich schools, the Southern Fried Chicken has now been taken off the menu.

Parents in attendance had the opportunity to ask any additional questions, which included a discussion about the pricing of school meals and how the continued progress of the contract would be monitored. The current price of school meals will remain as it is for the foreseeable future -- however, changes in the cost of food supplies could, in the future, impact on the price. Chartwells advised that, as much as possible, they absorb many increases, which they are able to do as they are part of a larger organisation (Compass Group), but cannot guarantee this will always be possible. The school is confident that the initial issues experienced at the start of the contract are now resolved and regular contact between the school and Chartwells enables the continued development of the contract.

### **PUPIL ASSET**

Parents are able to edit their own details in Pupil Asset, so, if you have switched phone numbers or even spot a mistake, there is now no need to make a request from the school office, you can just log in and make the change yourself.

To log in to Pupil Asset, parents can either download their Parent App or log in to their ParentPortal. To create a password for the ParentPortal, please go to http://parents.pupilasset.com/ and select Login Via ParentPortal, then First Time Login. Alternatively, you can download their app, either for iPhone from https://apps.apple.com/gb/app/pupil-asset-parent-app/id1490994393, or for Android from https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.rnparentapp. Tap First Login then enter the email address we have on record for you. When you tap Submit, PA will send you an email which will allow you to set your password. Your password will need to be at least eight characters long and include a number, or you will be unable to log in. Please inform us if your email address has changed. Once you have created login details you will be able to sign in with them on the Login screen. Full instructions can be found at https://www.pupilasset.com/help/how-to-guide/parental-communicationcontactsemailsmspattr-/parents-app-overview-a-quide-for-parents. The app/portal will initially only be used for dinner payments -- you will not, for example, be able to select meals as demonstrated in the guide and, indeed, our rules regarding this will remain the same.



### **GDPR SIGN-UP**

The school office regularly hears from parents/carers who are not subscribed to the Weekly Wolfe mailing list and so are not up-to-date with school information. Due to GDPR regulations, any parent/carer who has not given specific permission for us to use their email address to circulate school notices (including the Weekly Wolfe) will not receive them. ### **REPORTING ABSENCES**

When reporting your child's absence by phone, please could all parents/carers ensure that the message they have left is clear, as the office staff will often find it is difficult to make out what has been said. Messages need to also state the specific reason for the absence, not just say, for example, "my child is unwell".

### **BREAKFAST CLUB BOOKING**

Breakfast Club is available for booking via our online booking system, with bookings by the day, week or term available. Places are allocated on a first come, first served basis and are limited. If you would like to cancel a booking, please request this from the school office, who will generate an automatic refund for any session that has not yet taken place. Please note, however, that only whole bookings can be cancelled, not individual days from a booking -- we would have to cancel the whole booking and you would then have to re-book for just the days you require.

Please can we remind parents that pupils must arrive by 8:30am.

The charge for the week remains at £12.50 (£2.50 per day), which must be paid when making the booking. Parents with Pupil Premium children or those who wish to pay with childcare vouchers must contact the school office before setting up a SchoolHire account, or they will be charged as normal.
