



Dear Parents,



Over the past two weeks, our assembly focus has been our school value of **Democracy**. This is particularly relevant at this time of year, as Saturday 20th November saw the United Nations mark its annual World Children's Day. At James Wolfe, we are proud to call ourselves a *Rights Respecting School*, which means that we actively promote the rights of all children as outlined in The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. The Convention sets out 54 articles that cover all aspects of a child's life, including: their right to an education; their right to play and relax; their right to be safe; and the knowledge that no one right is more important than another. Part of the work we do linked to the Convention is to educate our children on their rights and ensure that they understand that whilst nobody has the right to take away their rights, they equally do not have the right to take away someone else's. For example, by **respecting** their own right to an education by listening in class and working with their classmates, every child is then in turn **respecting** their peers' right to an education.

With this in mind, this week the children have been exploring the value of **Democracy** and how they can ensure that their voice is heard, whilst **respectfully** listening to the voices of others.

Article 12: "Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously."

In Key Stage 2, the children took to the polls to elect their class Student Council representative. Each candidate first had to write and then present their manifesto to their voters. The children were encouraged to think about how their manifesto linked to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child and how they could use their role as a Student Councillor to be the voice of their peers. The buzz of excitement has been felt across the school and we are now anxiously awaiting the final vote count. The successful candidates will be announced next week.

On that note, I wish you all wonderful weekend, whether that be relaxing at home or off exploring...

PUPIL ASSET

Parents are able to edit their own details in Pupil Asset, so, if you have switched phone numbers or even spot a mistake, there is now no need to make a request from the school office, you can just log in and make the change yourself.

To log in to Pupil Asset, parents can either download their Parent App or log in to their ParentPortal. To create a password for the ParentPortal, please go to http://parents.pupilasset.com/ and select Login Via ParentPortal, then First Time Login. Alternatively, you can download their app, either for iPhone from https://apps.apple.com/gb/app/pupil-asset-parent-app/id1490994393, or for Android from https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.rnparentapp. Tap First Login then enter the email address we have on record for you. When you tap Submit, PA will send you an email which will allow you to set your password. Your password will need to be at least eight characters long and include a number, or you will be unable to log in. Please inform us if your email address has changed. Once you have created login details you will be able to sign in with them on the Login screen. Full instructions can be found at https://www.pupilasset.com/help/how-to-guide/parental-communicationcontactsemailsmspattr-/parents-app-overview-a-guide-for-parents. The app/portal will initially only be used for dinner payments -- you will not, for example, be able to select meals as demonstrated in the guide and, indeed, our rules regarding this will remain the same.

NO PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL

REGISTER FOR FREE/SUBSIDISED MILK

School milk is FREE for children under the age of five, FREE to children entitled to Free School Meals and subsidised for all other children in primary education, meaning parents will pay around £15 per term. To register your child to receive milk in school daily, please go to <u>http://www.coolmilk.com</u>. **If you wish your child to** <u>receive milk, you must register, even if your child is under five.</u>

EXERCISE CLASSES

Have you tried ((BOUNCE))[™] yet? It's more than just an exercise class, it's a community! Whether it's motivating and supporting each other in class, or just looking around and sharing a smile, ((BOUNCE))[™] brings people together. Bouncefitbody are running classes at James Wolfe (6:30pm on Monday evenings), with the main aim of making fitness fun and more accessible for everyone! Plus, there's a discount for James Wolfe staff and parents.

((BOUNCE))[™] is a trampoline-based, hour-long exercise class of choreographed dance routines to burn calories fast, that finishes with fifteen minutes of toning.
