

BSL BILL - #BSLActNow

BSL may finally be given legal status as an official language! The BSL Bill, proposed by MP Rosie Cooper and supported by Rose Ayling-Ellis, amongst others, had its second reading in Parliament last Friday, where it passed unopposed, with the third reading due on 18th March.

Susan Daniels of the National Deaf Children's Society said it was "a historic day for British Sign Language users everywhere. With their language now well on the way to being recognised in law, they can feel jubilant, valued and optimistic about the future. There are also thousands of deaf children who use sign language and they will be very excited too. It's another big step towards a society where they're truly included. Until every deaf child gets the support they're entitled to and the same opportunities as everyone else, the fight will be far from over."

BSL was first recognised as an official language in the UK (after many years of campaigning) almost twenty years ago and this is now an important date in the d/Deaf community's calendar, celebrated as 'BSL Recognition Day' on 18th March every year. At the time, the government promised to consider giving BSL legal status -- however, nineteen years later, this still hasn't happened, meaning many d/Deaf people are unable to access essential information and services in their own language. In 2015, the Scottish Parliament passed a law giving BSL legal status and protection. An example of the impact of this bill was seen during their COVID daily briefings, where the Scottish d/Deaf community had full and immediate access to important health information, as there was always an interpreter standing next to Nicola Sturgeon. In England, there was no interpreter next to Boris Johnson, despite much campaigning from the d/Deaf community. This meant that BSL users had to wait to receive vital information in later bulletins, when the interpreter would be added (#whereistheinterpreter).

Our children were shown signing in a clip about the BSL Bill on BBC Breakfast News last Friday morning and we are very proud to be supporting the Bill! School success starts with attendance

ATTENDANCE

The current version of our Attendance Policy can be found on our school website. Parents are reminded of the importance of high attendance. High attendance leads to great achievement.

We receive a number of requests for pupils to be absent from school during term time. Parents are reminded that the school cannot authorise a leave of absence for a holiday and we will only grant a leave of absence for exceptional circumstances. The process for applying for a leave of absence is as follows:

- 1. A Request for a Leave of Absence form is completed by the parent.
- 2. An appointment will be made with the Headteacher or Head of Campus to discuss the request.
 - 3. The school decides if it will authorise the leave of absence.

Parents should note that flights (etc.) should not be booked before a leave of absence is authorised. Every day of school missed by a pupil reduces their attendance by 0.5%, meaning that a child with 95% attendance has missed ten whole days of school and a child with 90% attendance has missed twenty whole days of school. By the time a pupil is persistently absent (85% attendance), they have missed six weeks, or half a term, of schooling.

1	0.5%	99.5%
5	2.5%	97.5%
10	5%	95%
20	10%	90%
30	15%	85%

NO PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL

We remind all parents not to park in the restricted areas on the roads surrounding the school, particularly the roads surrounding our Royal Hill Campus, as they are part of a Low Traffic Neighbourhood (LTN). This is for the safety of all children arriving at and leaving the school, and is more important than ever due to the current road closures and road works taking place in the area.
