

Dear Parents,

Playing a board game <u>Going shopping</u> Baking a Cake Catching a bus or train <u>Going to the doctor</u>

What do all of these activities have in common? I can see you all scratching your heads, trying to think of what could possibly link 'playing a board game' with 'baking a cake'?. If I told you that you the word I was thinking of was *numeracy*, what would your reaction be?

For many people, the idea of maths evokes some strong emotions, much like my feelings towards Marmite - either you love it, or you hate it - but why? Considering numeracy is 'the ability to understand and use maths in daily life', and not the understanding of the more complex concepts of maths - such as algebra - that many feared at school, surely we should value its importance and not see numeracy as something to be afraid of!

Not many of you, myself included, will have known that yesterday was National Numeracy Day. I stumbled across it when having the pleasure of working with some children in Year 3, as they were exploring the concept of measurement and how to convert from centimetres to metres (and vice versa). I was astounded by the children's ability to problem-solve and explain their reasoning when answering questions about everyday activities, like whether an object would fit through a door. This got me thinking about how many adults - again, myself included - make mistakes when ordering things that turn out to be the wrong size, or end up cutting a piece of wood too short for its intended use. Is this because, for some people, maths was just a scary subject that they told themselves they 'didn't understand' or thought 'I'm just not good with numbers'?

The aim of the charity behind National Numeracy Day is to build the nation's number confidence and skills, and highlight the importance of numeracy within our everyday lives. Their research has shown a staggering number of adults who do not feel confident that they have the numeracy skills needed to undertake many of the activities mentioned above. As a result, the charity have created a number of resources to help support people in identifying their level of numeracy and what they can then do to develop their understanding further.



School success starts with attendance

ATTENDANCE

The current version of our Attendance Policy can be found on our school website. Parents are reminded of the importance of high attendance. High attendance leads to great achievement.

We receive a number of requests for pupils to be absent from school during term time. Parents are reminded that the school cannot authorise a leave of absence for a holiday and we will only grant a leave of absence for exceptional circumstances. The process for applying for a leave of absence is as follows:

1. A Request for a Leave of Absence form is completed by the parent.

- 2. An appointment will be made with the Headteacher or Head of Campus to discuss the request.
 - 3. The school decides if it will authorise the leave of absence.

Parents should note that flights (etc.) should not be booked before a leave of absence is authorised.

Every day of school missed by a pupil reduces their attendance by 0.5%, meaning that a child with 95% attendance has missed ten whole days of school and a child with 90% attendance has missed twenty whole days of school. By the time a pupil is persistently absent (85% attendance), they have missed six weeks, or half a term, of schooling.
