

CHANGES TO THE WEEKLY WOLFE

Additionally, we have been informed by our data protection advisors that the newsletter does not fall within GDPR and so we will be sending it out to all parents automatically via Pupil Asset, rather than using the mailing list we asked you to sign up to in the past. MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

Please can we ask parents to ensure they **do not put any medicines, tablets or creams into their child's bag**. Any medicine your child requires should be administered by school staff and can only be accepted by the school office if:

- 1) The medication has a **prescription label** stuck to it detailing the child's name.
- 2) The Parental Agreement for School/Setting to Administer Medicine form has been fully filled in, signed by the parent and handed in with the medication.
- 3) The medication is **in date**. Please note that parents are responsible for making a note of the expiry date and replacing medicine when required.

Two Epipens are needed in school for children requiring them. For Antibiotics, the prescription label must say it needs to be given **four** times a day.



BIKES & SCOOTERS

It's wonderful to see so many children scooting and cycling to school - however, for safety reasons, we ask that children do not ride them in the playground before or after school.



SICKNESS

We remind all parents that, if your child is absent unwell, this must be reported to the school every day that they do not attend. Children should not return to school until 48 hours after their last incidence of vomiting or diarrhoea.

We thank all parents for their ongoing support with this.
