



Before you apply...

You can apply for up to **six** secondary schools, listing them in order of preference.

Consider each school's admissions policies and previous years' application rates to see whether your child is likely to be offered a place.

For an indication of addresses offered by each school in the previous admission, check our secondary school offers map.

Your preference schools can be in Royal Greenwich or in other areas, but they can't be independent (fee paying) schools.

You don't have to list six schools, but the more schools you list, the better your chances of being offered a place at one of them.



Applying for a place

Application is NOT an automatic process – You must apply for a secondary school place for your child.

Applications should be made by the person with parental responsibility for the child.

You can apply to schools in any borough through the **e-admissions** website however you must apply through the portal of which you are resident.

Make sure you register so you can use the portal.

Tips on using your preferences wisely

Your preferences are up to you, but do be realistic. There's no guarantee you'll be offered a place at a preference school but here are some of our recommendations:

- don't 'waste' a preference by naming a school where your child is unlikely to be offered a place
- don't name a school that you'd not wish your child to attend any preference may be offered
- don't list the same school more than once as duplicates will be deleted
- include schools nearest to your home address otherwise, your child may end up being allocated to a school much further away.

Support with applications

Get help with your application

Royal Greenwich holds <u>school admission information sessions</u> to help parents and carers with applying for a school place.

The Families Information Service offers support to parents and carers who may need support with the school admissions process.

The service is available to everyone and provides:

- a wide range of information on local secondary schools
- support in making informed and realistic preferences
- help in completing the relevant forms
- information about the appeals process.

If you have questions about which schools will best meet your child's academic and developmental needs, or you require support in making your application, please contact the <u>Families Information</u> <u>Service</u>.



Offer of a place

Each of your preferences will be considered individually under each school's admission criteria. If more than one offer can be made from your list, you will be offered the school that is ranked highest.

If it is not possible to offer any of your preference schools, your child will be allocated a place at the nearest school with a vacancy.

If you apply online, you will be able to log in to your e-admissions account during the evening of 1st March 2024 to see the result of your application.

If you applied using the paper form, a letter will be posted, first class, on 1st March 2024 informing you of the outcome of your application.



Accepting a place

Offers must be accepted or declined.

If you do not accept an offer, you must email **school-admissions@royalgreenwich.gov.uk**. You can also respond via the e-admissions portal.

Respond by 15th March 2024. Offers not accepted or declined will be withdrawn.

If you do not accept the offer, you will need to confirm what alternative arrangements you are making for your child's education.
