Welcome to The Wolfe!



Following parent feedback, we are trialling a new format for our newsletter which will be sent out once a month. Each year group have the opportunity to share reminders and upcoming events and information about the learning taking place in class. We will still share whole-school information/notices below, as well as key dates.

Visitors always comment on how amazing the school is and my goal is to ensure the children leave James Wolfe ready for secondary school socially and academically, having experienced a huge number of opportunities. I have now been Headteacher at James Wolfe for over a year and I am so proud of what we have achieved. I have listed a few below:

- There have been transformations within the school including the Secret Garden, nearly-completed scooter track and turf ot Royal Hill, and our lovely first aid and quiet play area at Randall Place.
- Our Forest School is back up and running and the children in Reception now get to experience this with our forest school and Reception teacher, Ms Syrocki.
- Sports coaches, Mr Junior and Ms Saunders, have transformed the way P.E. is taught in our school, led by Mr Armson, and the children report a love for P.E..
- Music has been elevated with the introduction of Rock Band. Singing assemblies are a firm favourite and have been reintroduced.
- Important work on ensuring diversity in our curriculum is happening with the support of an expert in the field. Working parties include staff and parent feedback on systems and processes within our school. We have updated our behaviour policy adding discriminatory behaviour and report this to our governors.
- Pupils are part of leadership groups, have their voice heard and lead on events.
- Enrichment clubs take place every Friday and the children love to explore new hobbies.
- We had promotions within the school and appointed Mr Armson and Mrs Price (formerly Ms Herbert) as Assistant Headteachers. They have already had a huge impact on the school.
- We have become the Signature school to teach BSL within the borough for staff and the local community.
- Punchdrunk are coming back to lead on Immersive experiences at James Wolfe.
- Biscuits and Books sessions have been reintroduced and we look forward to future events where we can invite you in to see our wonderful school.

I can't believe that I am already writing about December events! A Winter Newsletter will come to you in the next few weeks outlining the events. Don't forget, you can request a black and white copy of any letters, including this, from the school office.







Future Learning

Why did the Romans invade Britain? We will investigate! Reading 'Julius Zebra - Rumble with the Romans' by Gary Northfield. We will be exploring the features of diary entries and writing our own using detailed descriptions of characters. Also, we will be designing our own Roman sandals - understanding a plan and prototype. Science will help us to understand the states of solid, liquid and gas - understanding particles... unlike the Ancient Romans did! In RE we'll be studying different forms of worship and celebrations across different religions, including Christianity, Islam, Buddhism and Hinduism.
