A reminder of the current guidance regarding possible COVID-19 infections:

## People with symptoms of a respiratory infection

UKHSA guidance sets out that people with symptoms of a respiratory infection, such as COVID-19, and who have a high temperature or do not feel well, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with others. Those who are asked – or choose to test – and get a positive COVID-19 result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days following the day of their positive result.

There is some evidence that children have a shorter duration of illness compared to adults. Children and young people who are asymptomatic, choose to take a COVID-19 test and receive a positive test result are advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for three days after the day of the test.

The likelihood is that if children are now absent due to a COVID infection, then they will be unwell and not expected to complete home-learning, therefore the school's virtual teacher programme will no longer run.
