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Create a mask

Use plain paper or cardboard to create a mask in the style of a character from the *Tom Gates* or *Diary of a Wimpy Kid* series. Children wear a plain white top and black trousers.



Re-use Halloween costumes

There are plenty of characters children could become with a witch's hat or superhero cape. If you do not have these already, they can be made with a piece of cardboard or black bin liner. You could even re-fashion as stick or twig to become a magic wand.



Wear your pyjamas

Lots of children's characters wear pyjamas during their adventures. These can be worn to school on top of warmer clothes.





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Raid your wardrobe

- Wear a stripy top to become Burglar Bill, Omar or Amazing Grace.
- Wear red and dress up as Ada Twist, Tracy Beaker, Little Bad Man or George with his marvellous medicine.
- If you have any orange clothes, use them to become the main characters from Charlie & Lola or Look Up!
- Wear a green top and come to school as Peter Pan or The Little Prince.
- Wear a blue top with a bandage round your head to become Mr Bump, or wear a blue jacket and make some bunny ears to become Peter Rabbit.
- A blue dress would be perfect to dress up as Matilda, Dorothy, or Ruby, while a blue shirt would be great to dress up as Amari.
- Transform into the dictionary! Wear a white top and use sticky labels to cover it in words.
